Effective **April 1st, 2020**, Aetna Better Health of Florida will implement changes on the way that HCPCS Code **J3145** Injection, testosterone undecanoate, 1 mg (Aveed®) is reviewed and paid.

When billing **HCPCS Code J3145** you will be required to:

1. Request a prior authorization for this service
2. Submit documentation of trial and failure of two preferred agents in addition to meeting clinical criteria in order to be considered for coverage.
